Embark on excursions allowing first-hand engagement with course content

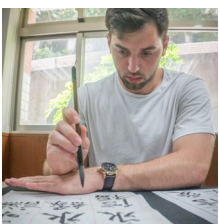
Develop valuable communication skills in Chinese language classes (no background in Chinese required)

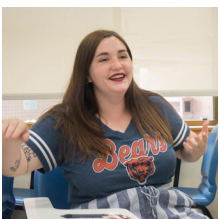

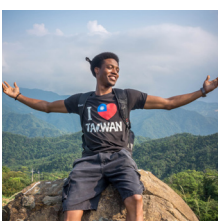
